Content:	Showing people around a town
Media:	photos, videos, Learning Management System ILIAS

Title	Stralsund – the place to be!
Purpose	In this task you will enhance your ability to practice summarizing information and giving structure to information. Furthermore you will exchange your ideas in the group by creating a wiki.
Brief summary	Collect information for the topic according the group you are a member in by using the internet, youtube or any sources you may need. A good website is, of course, the Tourist Center website, but also check tripadvisor to get more ideas.

Individual Contribution	After surfing the net and watching the video for information about Stralsund, write short summaries. Use the given wikis for this. Some of the structure is given but feel free to add some more categories if you need them. Make sure that you make at least 3 contributions and that your summary does not exceed 150 words. Connect your contributions to your E-Portfolio or blog. The task should be completed within the next 4 days.
Dialogue begins	Read the contributions of your colleagues. Revise them by adding information or deleting unnecessary information. For conversation you can use the forum in your groups. You have 4 days to complete the task.
E-moderator interventions	The E-moderator will read all contributions and of course on the SOS-Forum in case students need help with the task or with the technical aspects of ILIAS. He should additionally pay attention to the discussions in the forum in case problems within the group occur.

Time schedule	Study time will be about 7-8 hours a week.
